7 Steps to Rising Up (From Defense to Offense)

Question	Answer
<p>1. Your location is a servant for your destination</p> <p>What is the location of the character?</p>	
<p>2. First things first (Listen and respond)</p> <p>What did the character hear?</p> <p>How did the character respond?</p>	
<p>3. Press past majority opinion</p> <p>What did the majority try to dissuade or persuade the character?</p>	
<p>4. God speaks through commissioned people</p> <p>Who did God speak through?</p>	
<p>5. Take it off</p> <p>What did the character have to take off before the blessing could go on?</p>	
<p>6. Want vs. Need</p> <p>What did the character want?</p>

<p>7. Change only comes when fellowship is desired.</p> <p>What change came to the character?</p>	

The FACTS

Question	Answer
<p>Fact 1: Hurt can be passed on from uncontrollable sources.</p> <p>What was the source of the hurt?</p>	
<p>Fact 2: The closer the tie the tighter the knot.</p> <p>What was the tie between the person hurt and the person(s) causing the hurt?</p>	
<p>Fact 3: Hurt causes painful separations (Walls go up, trust come down).</p> <p>What separation was did the hurt cause?</p> <p>What trust was forfeited?</p>	
<p>Fact 4: Hurt keeps company with like-minded people.</p>

What kind of people did the hurt person associate with?	
Fact 5: Hurt needs time to heal. How does the passage mention time?	
Fact 6: Hurt can be the back door to your destiny. What was destiny's back door in the passage?	
Fact 7: Don't miss the point to release your hurt. How did the person release the hurt? What could have prevented the person from releasing the hurt?
